

Guideline Master's Thesis

The completion of the Data Science programme requires a Master's thesis. The most important issue is the question of the topic and the supervisor.

Where do I find a topic?

The topic of your Master's should be related to any of the courses in your master programme.

Who can supervise my Master's thesis?

First, we recommend contacting supervisors of classes/areas that you have already been in touch with, e.g. from your [mandatory courses](#), [data science project or research seminar](#). The second alternative is to contact Board members of the Research Network Data Science for potential supervision (<https://datascience.univie.ac.at/about-us>). If you are considering a supervisor from another institution, they can be co-supervisor. In principle, the main supervisor must be an instructor from the University of Vienna. If the main supervisor is not a Board member of the Research Network Data Science, then the SPL (Directorate of Studies) will consult the Data Science Coordinator of the respective programme to get approval for topic and supervision.

Formal requirements

When you have agreed with your supervisor on a potential topic, you need to register your topic formally with the SSC. They will also check if you have finished all the required modules.
